We will have our annual Veterans Day program on Friday, November 11, 2022, at 9:30 AM in the high school gym. Veterans and other guests should enter at door #7.


November 14*-18*, the Junior Honor Society and Student Council are hosting a food drive. All items collected will be given to our local food pantries in Matthews, Upland, and Van Buren. Items will be collected during 1* period each day. The 1* period class that brings in the most will earn a pancake breakfast. Each day will have a theme, and certain items will be worth double points. Here are the daily themes:

Monday, Nov. 14th	Macaroni & Meat Monday – Bonus points for all pastas and canned meat Ex: boxed pastas, canned pastas like ravioli, macaroni and cheese, hamburger helper, Knorr sides, canned chicken, canned beef, sloppy joe sauce, peanut butter, etc
Tuesday, Nov. 15th	Toiletry Tuesday – Bonus points for all toiletries and cleaning products (no travel sizes) Ex: toilet paper, soap, hand sanitizer, tissues, laundry detergent, toothpaste, shampoo, etc
Wednesday, Nov. 16 th	Wheat Wednesday – Bonus points for all wheats/grains Ex: oats, cereal, rice, etc
Thursday, Nov. 17 th	Thermos Thursday – Bonus points for all soups and broths Ex: canned soups, canned broths, Ramen (a package containing multiple packages of Ramen not single Raman packages), etc

We encourage all students to serve our community by bringing in items each day!


7th Grade Science

The 7th graders are finishing a unit on forces and motion. We did multiple activities in class and experimented with simulators online to show how forces interact with each other and change the motion of objects. We dropped medicine balls and basketballs, flicked pennies, rolled scooters, and pushed marbles and golf balls on a sheet of plastic. We also built and tested catapults in class to show how Newton's Laws of motion affect




projectiles (marshmallows, marbles, and bb's). Be sure to ask your child how the catapults worked!

The next unit which will start in November involves a new book called, "Inside the Restless Earth." We will be talking about the rock cycle, volcanos, tectonic plates, earthquakes, and the structure of the Earth under




our feet. Be on the lookout for interesting rocks around your house because every rock has a story!



Eighth Grade Math

In November, eighth grade math students will begin learning to graph linear equations using a table, slope-intercept form, and x- and y-intercepts. An equation is linear if a constant change in the x-value corresponds to a constant change in the y-value.



Algebra students will continue graphing linear functions. Students will find the slope of a line, which tells how steep the line is. The slope of a line is the ratio of rise to run for any two points on the line. Students will also learn how changing the slope and y-intercept of a linear function changes the position of the graph.

Mrs. Jarck's 8th grade Language Arts classes just wrapped a terrific unit all about HORROR! This unit came at the perfect time of year, right in the middle of the spooky season. We learned about Edgar Allan Poe and his questionable life choices, read many stories with spine-tingling, disturbing endings, and even spent some time in an escape room. The highlight of this unit, however, was probably our Edgar Allan Poe murder mystery day. Although maybe not nearly as exciting, we also spent time learning about some essential language arts concepts such as symbolism, verb tenses, unreliable narrators, and how to format dialogue in our narrative writing. I have really enjoyed teaching this unit, and I hope students enjoyed it as well!

Our next unit in our textbook is titled The Places We Call Home, and this unit will focus on multiculturalism here in the United States. We will explore some native american cultures and customs, learn about different countries and cultures from far away places like Kazakhstan and Panama, and discover the difficulties many immigrants face when coming to America. Students often learn so much about the world around them in this unit, and learn about themselves along the way.

This past month in Miss Watts' ELA classes, students had the opportunity to create an infographic. An Infographic is basically an artistic representation of data and information using different elements such as graphs, pictures, and narratives. Students have been doing research over raising positive self-esteem and rejecting negative thinking. This project goes hand in hand with a short story we read, where the main character is suffering from poor self-esteem. Students have been using creative ideas to create fun and artistic infographics.

This month, we will be writing memoirs! A memoir is a narrative, written from the perspective of the author, about an important part of their life. To define memoir, we loosen the constraints of an autobiography. Memoir authors choose a pivotal moment in their lives and try to recreate the event through storytelling. The author's feelings and assumptions are central to the narrative. Memoirs still include all the facts of the event, but the author has more flexibility here because they are telling a story as they remember it, not as others can prove or disprove it. Students will be picking one important moment in their lives to write about. I am looking forward to reading their stories and seeing their creativity!
